

This Sunday, Jan 21, those preparing for First Communion will be presented with a framed copy of the Lord's Prayer during the Sunday mass followed by Children's Liturgy of the Word. Please pray for those children preparing to come to the table of the Lord for the first time.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

There will be Liturgy of the Word for children at the Sunday morning mass this week, Jan 21. What is Children's Liturgy of the Word? It refers to the practice of children of primary school age leaving the Sunday assembly during the Liturgy of the Word and gathering elsewhere with an adult catechist to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to their level of understanding. All primary aged children in the congregation are invited to participate in Children's Liturgy of the Word. Children wishing to participate should come into the center isle of the church when the priest calls the children forward.

FIRST CORINTHIANS

On Sundays between Christmas Time and Lent, the Second Reading at Mass is taken from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians. On Ordinary Time Sundays throughout the year, the Second Reading gives us several excerpts from the same New Testament letter for several consecutive weeks. Usually we hear from a given letter for one series of weeks every three years. However, Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians is an exception. It is a long, important letter, so the lectionary divides it up into three parts. We hear from it every year as Ordinary Time first gets underway. Earlier in his career, St. Paul had made a lengthy visit to Corinth. After he left, members of the young Christian community contacted him about some problems and questions they were facing in his absence. St. Paul deals with these issues one by one. When we read the letter today, we learn about the challenges in the early church and the position Paul held on controversial topics, and we realize that some things haven't changed. It is comforting to know that the issues we face today are not new and that the solutions Paul proposes are still practical and inspirational. The letter includes many famous passages: the divided community of Corinth, God's choice of the weak instead of the strong, the Cross of Christ as a stumbling block for many, the unmarried life, the imperative to preach the Gospel, the Body of Christ, the gift of love, the Resurrection of Christ, and the eternal life of believers. For several weeks each year, we hear familiar passages from one of the Bible's great letters. The pastoral, hopeful message of Paul can always inspire those who drop everything else and listen to his words.
