HELP WITH LOVE OUR COMMUNITY MEAL ON AUGUST 1

Holy Spirit Parish will be serving an evening meal through Love Our Community, Thursday August 1st. The meal *(meatball sandwiches, cucumber salad, chips, cookies and water)* will be prepared in our kitchen for 150+ people and transported to Hartville Memorial Park pavilion where we will serve it. In the past approximately half of the meals were packed to-go for those who are homebound or simply do not have transportation to get to the park for the meal.

We need help in the following ways:

Before August 1:

Bake cookies (30+ dozen are needed, preferably homemade) Please let Mark know how many. Please package two cookies to a sandwich bag for easier handling. Any extras will go to the Alliance Catholic Worker. Bring to the Holy Spirit Kitchen by noon on August 1.

On August 1:

At 1:00 pm, 5-6 people to prepare the meal in the Holy Spirit kitchen.

Around 4:00 pm, transport the meal to the pavilion.

At 5 until after 7:30 pm, serve the meal.

Deliver meal to those who are homebound or do not have transportation.

Come when you can and leave when you need to, please let Mark know how, when, and for how long.

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar, and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.

Call to Family, Community, and Participation

The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society—in economics and politics, in law and policy directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and the family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and wellbeing of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.
