At 5 until after 7:30 pm, serve the meal.

Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar, and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.

#### **Rights and Responsibilities**

The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities--to one another, to our families, and to the larger society.

## THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: A HOLY SPIRIT PARISHIONER'S EXPERIENCE

The three-year National Eucharistic Revival launched by the

U.S. Catholic bishops June 19, 2022 on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body of Jesus Christ (*Corpus Christi*) as an effort to revive devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, has come to a climax this month with the National Eucharistic Congress recently held in Indianapolis, Indiana July 17-21.



Holy Spirit parishioner Jane Enix, was blessed to have been able to participate in one of four National Eucharistic Proces-



sions as participants journeyed with Christ in the Eucharist the from northeast coast of the United States to the National Eucharistic Congress Indianapolis. proces-This

sion eventually converged with the three other National Eucharist Processions coming from the north, south, and west edges of our country, coming together as One Body at the 10<sup>th</sup> National Eucharistic Congress.

Jane also made the pilgrimage to Indianapolis for this National Eucharistic Congress along with an anticipated 50,000 other Catholics from across the country.

Jane shared:

"It has been a very emotional and fulfilling day and it's not over yet. One word to express my feelings is love. Love for the Lord and feeling His transformation in me. I am filled with awe and the Holy Spirit, with a sense of community, fellowship and belonging!"

Though the Eucharistic Congress is over, the three-year effort will now be followed by a year of Eucharist-based missions throughout the country as Catholics are encouraged to introduce Christ to others so that they too may experience Christ's transformative love and be blessed by his sacraments.

May this Eucharistic Revival enable all of us to deepen our commitment to a life of discipleship that is sustained and nourished by a deeper devotion to the Eucharist.




